Questions and Answer Corner

Why are we not able to use the school building?

What is the cost?

St. Bartholomew has entered into a contract with HUD and Catholic Charities to build Senior Housing (at no cost to us). By doing this, we lose the use of the building and we will need alternative space. It has been suggested to add 4,500 sq. feet on the parish office side of Barth Hall. By doing so we can:

- Create an accessible multifunctional conference and retreat center that meets the ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) requirement.
- This will include multiple spaces for meetings where several groups could meet on the same day/time: 1. Space for existing groups, 2. Seniors, 3. Scouts, 4. Men's Club and 5. Future groups.
- The addition of 3-4 classrooms for Adult and Children's Formation.
- With the expansion of Barth Hall, there will be a major reduction in overhead expenses (i.e., utilities, insurance and maintenance costs).

The projected cost in 2009 was \$410k minus \$175k to be realized from the sale of the school leaving a balance of \$235k to complete the project.

The expansion of Barth Hall is in response to our goals to Grow in Faith Formation, Encourage Active Participation by Parishioners, Build Community Among Each Other and Reach Out to Our Neighbors.
