## Help Us Raise Awareness About Ending Torture

The Louisville Torture Abolition Project invites faith based groups and individuals to participate in local efforts to educate and advocate against continuing U.S.-supported torture. The Ursuline Sisters' Social Concerns Committee is a co-sponsor of events in Louisville this June. As part of these efforts, local participants will “stand in solidarity” with the National Torture Abolition and Survivors Support Coalition (TASSC) on Wednesday, June 25, from 11 a.m. until 1 p.m. at Thomas Merton Square in Downtown Louisville. TASSC was founded by Sr. Dianna Ortiz, a Maple Mount, KY, Ursuline Sister who was abducted, raped and tortured in Guatemala 21 years ago.
